# School INFORMATION

**NEW FAMILIES** We are excited about the opportunity to work closely with your family to prepare your children for the future. We encourage you to get involved in any way that you can. We will likewise do our part to make the transition smooth for your family. We understand that lives are extremely busy sometimes, so, regardless of what you are able to contribute to your school in time, talents, and gifts, it will all be much appreciated and help unify our families together as we learn and grow together. Don't miss out on Orientation, August 14. It will be a time to become familiar with the facilities, staff, and get answers to any questions you might have before school starts on August 18.

**CARPOOL LINES** Our carpool system is designed to provide safety, order, and a service to our families. It is imperative that parents observe all traffic flow patterns and follow the instructions of the assigned traffic personnel. Please move as far forward in the carpool line as possible and have your children ready to exit the vehicle at the time you arrive. We also ask that parents remain in their vehicles while our morning duty staff assist the smaller children to keep the flow of traffic moving. All students will arrive and depart at the front entrance. If you have an elementary and an upper school student, please come as close to 3:00 p.m. as you can (the latest pickup time). Student drivers will park in the front of the school only.

**VISITOR PARKING** Please drop off or pick up your student in the carpool line before entering the school. If you need to get out of your vehicle, please proceed to the designated visitor parking area. During the school day all entrances will remain locked other than the front entrance. Therefore, all visitors must sign in at the front office and receive a name tag.

**STUDENT PARKING** Any student with a valid driver's license may purchase a Student Parking Tag. Students should complete the *Student Vehicle Registration Form* available on our website at [www.ccscolts.org](http://www.ccscolts.org) or pick one up from the Attendance Office. The cost for each Student Tag is \$25.00 (non-refundable). Students may also visit the Attendance Office to acquire a Driver Eligibility Certificate if they are planning on getting their driver's permit from the DMV during the upcoming school year.

**CAR SIGNS** Car signs will be given to all new families at Orientation. They must be used when picking up student(s) in the carpool line.

**IMPORTANT TIMES** Students may arrive at 7:30 a.m. Please do not arrive before then; we do not have supervision available. Elementary students will report to the library while upper school students will report to the cafetorium. Students may report to class at 7:50 a.m. All students must be in classrooms by 8:00 a.m. Dismissal times are as follows: Lower School (K4 - 5<sup>th</sup> grade) – 2:30 p.m. and Upper School (6<sup>th</sup> – 12<sup>th</sup>) – 3:00 p.m.

**IMMUNIZATION RECORDS** The NC Department of Non-Public Education requires we have all immunization records on file before the first day of school. If you have not submitted a copy, please do before August 18.


**LOST AND FOUND** Lost and found items are located in the Attendance Office. Please label all personal property to help us minimize the number of items that are never claimed. Periodically, the office will donate items to local agencies and places of need after items have been in the Lost and Found for an extended period of time.

**ATTENDANCE POLICY** Regular attendance is a critical component for success in school. Students must attend four hours of the school day to be counted present (Upper School students: Attendance is taken per class; you must be present in at least 4 classes to be counted present.) See the Student Handbook for complete details of the Attendance Policy. Students are in jeopardy of not receiving credit for classes and potential retention if they miss more than 10 days/classes per semester (or 20 days/classes per school year).

## LATE ARRIVAL AND EARLY DISMISSAL

Students will need to arrive in their homerooms by 8:00 a.m. to avoid being tardy. Students arriving after 8:00 a.m. must report to the Attendance Office near the front entrance to receive an admit slip prior to going to their classrooms. After 8:05 a.m., the only doors unlocked will be at the front entrance of the school. See the Attendance Policy in the Student Handbook for a complete list of Excused/Unexcused Absences and Tardies. Students leaving school early will need to sign out in the Attendance Office.

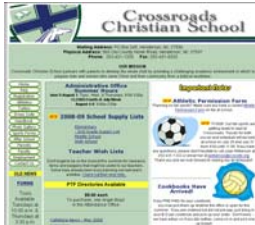

# More School INFORMATION

**RenWeb** RenWeb is our web-based tool that allows you immediate access to your child's information using our website.



**Using RenWeb** Once RenWeb is ready for parents to access in the new school year, you will receive an e-mail from the school. On RenWeb, you will be able to check your child's grades, homework, lunch accounts, attendance, and discipline issues. You will also be able to view schoolwide announcements and classroom and school calendars.

**DISCIPLINE** The Middle and High School have a new discipline system based on points. Please review this system carefully with your child. To do so, go to our website and click the Handbook button. You will then be able

## MEDICATION FORMS

Students must have a medication form on file in the nurse's station in order to take any prescription or over-the-counter medications at school. Medicines must be in their original prescription bottles (no zip-lock bags) and are prohibited outside of the school offices. The office keeps a log of all medication supplied to students. If your student requires an inhaler or epi-pen, these supplies must be kept in the school office. All medical forms are only in effect for one school year at a time and must be filled out at the beginning of each new school year. You may download any of the medical forms needed from our website. Medications should be taken before or after school if at all possible.

**COOKBOOKS** Get your first CCS Cookbook before they are all gone!! You can purchase the book of mouthwatering recipes for \$10 in the office.

**Hot Lunches** CCS offers hot lunches each day for our faculty, staff and students. The lunch menu for August and each subsequent month will be posted on our web site by the 1<sup>st</sup> of each month. You may also get a copy of the August lunch menu at [Orientation](#). Seniors will be allowed to go off campus for lunch daily. Juniors will be allowed to go off campus one day per week with an additional day per week for each 9-week period. Juniors and seniors must have submitted an Off-Campus Lunch Form prior to leaving campus the first time. These may be obtained in the Attendance Office. Juniors and seniors may also have lunch in the courtyard area daily. Students will not be allowed to have food brought in or delivered unless the parent is joining his/her student for lunch. A lunch plate costs \$3.00 for Lower School; \$3.50 for Upper School. All lunches will be eaten in the cafeterium unless special arrangements have been made with the administration. **NO FOOD** is allowed in the classrooms. We love our cafeteria staff! They are Dawn Overby, Becky Preddy and Lynne Thomas.

## SENIOR INFORMATION

Seniors, along with at least one of their parents, will have a mandatory parent meeting in early September to discuss LOTS of Senior dates and information.



**MEDIA CENTER** Have you visited our library? We have over 7,500 books and many wonderful magazines. ## TELEPHONE

**USAGE** Student telephone usage will be very limited and should only be used for emergencies. In an emergency, students should report to the Attendance Office to make those telephone calls. Students are expected to be responsible for having their homework on time and will not be allowed to call home to have it brought in.

**DRUG TESTING** The Board of Trustees, along with the administration of the school, has unanimously agreed to provide drug tests at no costs to all high school students (grades 9<sup>th</sup> – 12<sup>th</sup>). We are committed to maintaining high standards and providing accountability for our students. Failure to comply or pass the drug test will lead to immediate dismissal from the school. **DRESS CODE** Please refer to the Student Handbook on our website for detailed information. Remember: Modesty and neatness are required!

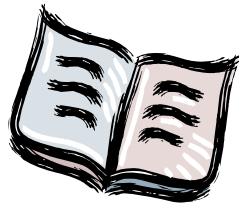
