## 2010-11 TUITION AND FINANCIAL INFORMATION

**TUITION:** The tuition is \$3,000 for K4; \$4,000 for Kindergarten; \$5,000 for grades 1-12. Tuition will be prorated for students who enroll after the school year begins. Families enrolling three or more children receive a 50% discount on tuition for the youngest child(ren).

**Total K3 program fees** are \$6,890.00 (\$6,240.00 tuition, \$250 registration fee, \$100 book/curriculum fee, \$300 resource fee). **NOTE:** The K3 program is year-round, 7:30 a.m.–6:00 p.m., Mon.–Fri. **The multiple child discount does not apply to the K3 program.**

**REGISTRATION FEE:** The registration fee is \$250 per year (per child). This fee must accompany the student application. This fee covers administrative costs and must be received before we can process the application. (Non-Refundable)

**BOOK/CURRICULUM FEE:** The book fee is \$250 per year (per child). This fee covers books, classroom supplies, and equipment. If a student withdraws prior to the start of the school year, any books or supplies are forfeited. The book fee is due by July 1. (Non-Refundable)

**RESOURCE FEE:** The resource fee is \$300 per year (per child). This fee covers additional operational expenses that are not included in tuition, registration, or book fees such as technological upgrades, teacher supplements, maintenance, unexpected expenses, etc. The resource fee is due by August 1 or can be added to your monthly tuition payments through FACTS. (Non-Refundable)

**BUS FEE:** The bus fee, if applicable, is \$673 per year per student. This fee can be paid as a lump sum by August 1 or can be added to your monthly tuition payments through FACTS. It is a yearly commitment. (Non-Refundable)

**ATHLETIC FEE:** A \$50 athletic fee per child is due prior to the first practice of the first sport; for each additional sport in the school year, the athletic fee is \$25 per sport. This fee is for athletic participants only. The athletic fee covers miscellaneous athletic costs to include conference fees, coach stipends, equipment, field/gym floor maintenance, transportation, etc. (Non-Refundable)

**ANNUAL FUND:** A yearly tax-deductible gift is requested per family. Your gift, in any amount, to the Annual Fund is very important, and every family is encouraged to give. The contributions to the Annual Fund will provide additional financial resources to improve and expand the overall programs of CCS.

**TUITION PAYMENT OPTIONS:** **Option A: Full Payment Plan.** This plan offers a 3% discount if tuition is paid in full by July 1. If not paid by July 1, the discount is lost. **Option B: Monthly Payments.** This plan is payable by bank draft through FACTS. No monthly payments will extend beyond June 1. Any accounts 30 days past due will result in a student's temporary suspension until the accounts are current. Records are not transferable to other schools for accounts that have past-due balances.

**WITHDRAWALS:** Students are considered enrolled for the entire school year. Therefore, budgets and teacher contracts are set accordingly. Early withdrawals create an opening CCS may not be able to fill. Therefore, students withdrawing prior to the first day of school will forfeit all fees paid. Students are not considered withdrawn until a Student Withdrawal Form has been received by the Enrollment Coordinator. Any tuition paid prior to school starting shall be refunded in its entirety. After the first day of the school, families withdrawing students will be responsible for the current month plus two additional months' tuition for each student in attendance. Records are not transferable to other schools for accounts that have past-due balances.

## STATEMENT OF COOPERATION

**SCHOOL ACTIVITIES:** We give permission for our child(ren) to take part in any and all school activities, class field trips, including sports and school-sponsored trips away from the school premises, and absolve the school from liability to us or our child(ren) because of any injury to us or our child(ren) at school or during any school activity. In the case of an emergency, we request that the school contact us first. If we are not available, please contact the designated emergency contact. If the emergency contact cannot be reached, the school has my permission to make whatever arrangements deemed necessary for our child(ren)'s treatment.

**CARPOOL PATTERN:** We understand CCS has a carpool procedure that ensures the safety of the students, and it is our responsibility to follow that procedure. If we need to pick up or drop off students during the school day, we will park in a designated space and avoid blocking the carpool lane.

**LATE PICKUPS:** If parents are 15 minutes late in picking up students, the students will be signed into the after-school care center and should be picked up there. There will be a \$7.00 per hour charge for any part of the first or subsequent hours. Non-payment will result in the suspension of services.

**DISCIPLINE:** Discipline is an aspect of a child's education. We give permission for our child(ren)'s teacher and/or administration to make and enforce school regulations and policies, including the Demerit System, in a manner consistent with Christian principles and discipline as set forth in Scriptures.

**PARENTAL COMMITMENT:** We understand students are accepted on a general probationary status for the first quarter. We agree that we will in no case complain to other parents, but will register only necessary complaints with the teacher or administration following the Matthew 18 principle. We pledge our full cooperation to keep doctrinal controversy out of the school. We agree to support the school with our prayers and positive attitude. We understand that CCS has the right to dismiss students for lack of cooperation on the part of the student, parent and/or guardian.

**NON-DISCRIMINATION POLICY:** Crossroads Christian School admits students of any race, color, national, and ethnic origin to all the rights, privileges, programs, and activities generally accorded or made available to students of the school. It does not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national, or ethnic origin in administration of its educational policies, admissions policies, scholarship and loan programs, and athletic and other school-administered programs. The Non-Discrimination Policy of Crossroads Christian School also includes the hiring of faculty and administrative staff. - teach of the vicarious atonement for the sins of all peoples by the shedding of Jesus Christ's blood on the cross (Romans 10:9; Rom. 3:23-25; Hebrews 13:12; Hebrews 9:22-28; I Peter 3:18; John 3:16; I John 1:7); and the resurrection of His body from the tomb ( I Cor. 15:3-4; I Peter 3:18; II Cor. 5:15; Hebrews 9:22-28);
- and teach of God's power to save mankind from sin through the new birth of regeneration of the Holy Spirit and the gift of eternal life by the grace of God (John 14:6; I John 2:2; Eph. 2:8-9; Rom. 5:8-10; John 3:16-17; Titus 3:5; Rom.6:22-23; II Cor. 5:17).
