## ParentsWeb

**RenWeb School Management Software** gives you, the busy parent, an opportunity to get more involved in your child's academic progress and future success – all via the Internet!

**RenWeb ParentsWeb** is a private and secure website that has been set up for our school to allow you to see complete information specific to your child. You can view your child's grades, attendance, homework and conduct, as well as other useful school information. You can also communicate with teachers and other school staff online whenever necessary. All you need is an Internet-capable computer.

Here's how to access our easy-to-use **RenWeb ParentsWeb**:

- Go to Internet Explorer and type in the address of our school website at [www.ccscolts.org](http://www.ccscolts.org).
- Click on the RenWeb logo on the CCS home page. 
- Log in as follows:
  1. Click on the "First-time Users" tab if you have not logged into RenWeb before.
  2. Type in your email address that you provided to the school. (*Note: We must have a **valid** email address in our system for you to be able to log into ParentsWeb. Some email users who have not logged into their email accounts in awhile may have difficulty as some email providers, like Earthlink, disable inactive email accounts after a period of time.*)
  3. Click on the New Parent Login button. You will be emailed a new password within 3 minutes (to the email address you typed in, which must be the same email address that you provided to the school).
  4. Type in the Password assigned.
  5. If you want to avoid re-keying your email address each time you log in, tell the system to remember your email address so you need only enter your password to log into the ParentsWeb in the future.
  6. Click on the Parent Login button.

- Once you are logged into ParentsWeb, click  to see all that is available.
