



BIBLIOGRAPHY GUIDELINES

Alphabetize the bibliography according to the authors' last names. If you can't find an author's name, alphabetize according to the first word in the title.

Be sure to underline titles of books and magazines. Use quotation marks around titles of articles.

Put the date you used a website at the end of its listing.

Use 12 pt. font for the entire bibliography.
